

The Molteni Group includes four brands, each one a leader in its segment: Molteni&C (residential furnishings), Dada (kitchens), UniFor (workplace solutions), Citterio (partition walls and office furniture).

## Museum

The **Molteni Museum** was inaugurated in 2015 to celebrate the Molteni Group's 80th anniversary. The aim was to stage the **company's story**, its **identity** and its **core values**, by telling extraordinary stories of the men and women who have invented, created and built objects, work and social relationships. In 2021 the museum was moved to the Glass Cube space located in the Molteni Compound gardens, and was totally revamped by **Ron Gilad**.



“This year our products have been stimulated by a strong desire not to abandon fluidity, sensuality or comfort.

The concept of comfort is also visually translated in the tactility of the materials. Our eye is guided on every curve while a great feeling of calm emanates from the whole range. The notion of protection, of shelter, is very important in my work and I think the collection reflects that well. We are enveloped in these fluid forms as if we were inside a cocoon in which we would like to live ever”.

Living is once again central to every corner of the home. A theater of life experienced, where the quality of the home environment is the key premise for planning the various rooms: increasingly more versatile, multifunctional, able to adapt and mould itself to a second usage. An idea of a cosy, reassuring and welcoming home. But constantly evolving, which Molteni&C interprets through wall systems, the protagonists of the project and part and parcel of the architecture. *“The home aspires to holistic well-being and to organic playfulness”*, explains creative director Vincent Van Duysen, who is looking for lightness, fluidity and the etherial in the Molteni&C Dada 2022 narrative project. While in the previous few years the narrative project paid tribute to the great protagonists of international modernism, this year references to the roots of the movement are fleetingly mentioned, evocative. It mentions the atmospheres: the fluid homes, to be lived in, the large and convivial rooms linked one to the other, the permeable internal and external spaces. And above all that idea of space, extremely elegant but without any ostentation for ostentation's sake, in tune with the surrounding landscape. Paraphrasing Alvar Aalto: spaces that in their form express content and that content is linked to Nature. Vincent van Duysen imagines a single storey house, in which you can feel in touch with the ground, with the outdoors. Think of homes marked by transparency, organized with light-weight partitions and

wide outward-looking verandas and terraces: thresholds, open spaces halfway between indoors and outdoors, spaces that are private but in direct contact with light and Nature. *“It's a hymn”,* explains Vincent Van Duysen, *“to ethereal design, inspired by the great pavilions of the modernist era”*. Dynamic spaces characterized by the lightness of the lines, skillfully combined with details and materials that create softly shaped products.



Light becomes an integral part of the design of the space, because it modulates the way the architectural composition is perceived and expressed. In this approach, the furnishings and the modular units become protagonists in the layout of the rooms. They are part of the architecture, because they fuse with the very articulation of the house, integrating new compositional possibilities that wrap round the existing architectures, such as the fireplace, or foresee new built-in functions such as the bar and the home office. In this way a symbiosis is created between furnishing systems and architectural walls. And a dialogue between the structural and the mobile furniture, which become soloists within the home. Vincent Van Duysen is fond of pure, sensual-feeling material finishes. Pale and material woods, such as natural oak and eucalyptus, handbrushed or with visible grain, to create unique surfaces, live to the touch. In textiles he prefers light and earthy colors and material patterns that highlight the rounded shape of the cushions. For a home to be “felt”, soft and real. To be wrapped around itself, like a dress made to measure.

Light is the core of Joel Denot's work and his masterpieces have been chosen to accompany the new collection. Rather than producing imagery which merely captures the reality of the world around us, the observer immerses themselves in the lightness of light and air that Joel's work exudes. Denot's work is characterized by the uniqueness of colour that cannot be photographed since it does not exist in front of the camera, but inside it, created at the same moment as the process that captures it.

L'abitare torna centrale negli spazi della casa. Un teatro di vita vissuta, dove la qualità dell'ambiente è il presupposto cardine nella progettazione degli spazi: sempre più versatili, multifunzionali, capaci di adattarsi e potersi modellare a seconda dell'uso. Un'idea di casa accogliente, calda e rassicurante. Ma in continua evoluzione, che Molteni&C interpreta attraverso i sistemi a parete, protagonisti del progetto e parte integrante dell'architettura. *“La casa aspira al benessere olistico e alla giocosità organica”*, spiega il direttore creativo Vincent Van Duysen che, nel progetto narrativo Molteni&C Dada 2022, ricerca i concetti di leggerezza, etereità e fluidità. Se negli anni precedenti il progetto narrativo ha reso omaggio ai grandi protagonisti del modernismo internazionale, quest'anno il riferimento alle radici del movimento è accennato, evocativo. Ne cita le atmosfere: le abitazioni fluide, da vivere, gli ambienti collegati, ampi e conviviali, gli spazi interni ed esterni compenetranti. E soprattutto quell'idea di spazio dall'estrema eleganza ma privo di sfarzo fine a se stesso, in armonia con il paesaggio circostante. Parafrasando Alvar Aalto: spazi che nella forma esprimono un contenuto e quel contenuto è collegato alla Natura. Vincent van Duysen immagina una casa a un solo piano, per sentirsi in contatto con la terra, con l'esterno. Pensa ad abitazioni nel segno della

trasparenza, organizzate con parti leggere e grandi aperture verso verande e terrazze all'esterno: spazi liminari, liberi e a metà tra intero e open air; ambienti privati ma in contatto diretto con la luce e la natura. *“È un inno”*, spiega Vincent Van Duysen, *“a un design leggero, che si ispira ai grandi esempi di padiglioni dell'epoca modernista”*. La luce diviene parte integrante del design dell'ambiente, perché modula la percezione e l'espressione della composizione architettonica.

In questa logica, gli arredi e sistemi componibili diventano protagonisti nell'organizzazione degli ambienti. Sono parte dell'architettura, perché si fondono con l'articolazione stessa della casa, integrando nuove possibilità compositive che avvolgono architetture esistenti, come il cammino, o prevedono nuove funzionalità integrate come il bar e l'home office. Si viene così a creare una simbiosi tra sistemi arredativi e pareti architettoniche. È un dialogo tra gli arredi strutturali e quelli mobili, che divengono oggetti solisti nell'interno dell'abitazione. Vincent Van Duysen predilige nelle finiture materiali puri, sensuali da toccare. Legni chiari e materici come il rovere naturale e l'eucalipto, con venature a vista o spazzolati a mano, per creare superfici uniche e vive al tatto. Nei tessuti privilegia colori chiari e delle terre e trame materiche che fanno risaltare la forma stondata degli imbottiti. Per una casa da “sentire”, morbida e vera. Da arredare intorno a sé, come un abito su misura. La luce è anche al centro del lavoro di Joel Denot, le cui opere sono state scelte per accompagnare le immagini della nuova collezione. Anziché produrre delle raffigurazioni che si limitano a catturare la realtà del mondo che ci circonda, chi osserva si trova immerso nell'intensità della luce e nella luminosità dell'aria che trasuda dall'opera di Joel. Le opere di Denot sono caratterizzate dall'unicità del colore che non può essere catturato dall'apparecchio fotografico perché non esiste davanti alla fotocamera ma all'interno di essa, creato nello stesso momento in cui viene catturato dal processo fotografico.
